Steps for Post Secondary Education

1. Research colleges and create a list 2 (reach) -2 (target) -2 (probable)

Use search engines - check out Collegeboard/Naviance

2. Visit colleges / meet with colleges reps - In the School Counseling Office!

In-Person Tours and **Virtual** Tours offered through Admissions Department - go to website, participate in Open House, Info Sessions etc.

College rep visits at Pinkerton Academy listed on Naviance, Google classroom. **REGISTER IN NAVIANCE**

3. Identify how to apply, what materials are needed, and deadlines

Visit college website and look under Undergraduate Admissions

Know your deadlines and application type:

Early Decision	Early Action	Regular Decision	Rolling Admission
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Apply early, usually before December-If accepted, student is obligated to attend- make sure to understand and to evaluate the ED rules for that particular college	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Apply early, usually before December-Find out admissions decision early-Student is not obligated to attend if get in.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Standard deadline-Ensure meet deadline to be considered for admission	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Applications are reviewed on a first come, first served basis-Applications are accepted until class has been filled-Certain colleges and majors may have priority deadlines

- Students will request transcripts in Naviance and make sure they clarify which schools they will be applying to early action, regular decision, etc.
- Students will request letters of recommendation through Naviance.
- Teacher BRAG Sheet, Counselor BRAG Sheet. **30 days notice.**

Steps for Entering the Workforce



1. Take a career interest profiler (Naviance)/ASVAB

2. Research Career Interests

3. Begin to craft your resume

4. Review the Virtual Job Board for opportunities: [Virtual Job Board](#)

5. Attend a Virtual Job Fair or a Reverse Job Fair

6. Don't underestimate the power of connections/networking (internships, apprenticeships, ELOs)
