Matt Devine ran an 11.84 in the 100m dash. Luke Brennan ran 4:25.63 in the 1600m. Ethan Charles ran the 800m with a 2:06.82. Alex Leblanc ran a PR of 23.30 in the 200m.

The highlight of the meet came in the 4x400 relay where the team of Nick Harrington, Luke Brennan, Ethan Charles and Alex Leblanc raced to a 6th place finish from the slow heat. This qualifies them to run at New Englands.

Briana Danis defended her state discus title, winning in 124' 9". She also finished 2nd in the shot put by 1 inch with her throw of 37' 7".

Jordan Wheaton finished 2nd in the 100 Hurdles (15.29)

Jillian Severance finished tied for 4th in the Pole Vault, tying her PR of 8' 6".

All three relay squads finished in the top six, the only team that accomplished this, boys or girls. The 4 X 400 squad of Eva Roberts, Grace Jellow, Madison Connors, and anchor Hannah Sippel charged down the final stretch leaning at the tape and winning in dramatic fashion, The 4 X 100 relay of Jordan Wheaton, Madison Connors, Hannah Sippel and Eva Roberts finished second, nearly replicating their school record from a couple weeks ago. The 4 X 800 squad of Mimi Preble, Makenna Alden, Izzy Groulx, and Tess Silva finished 4th and took more than 3 seconds off their best time this season.
