It was a sunny, but cool evening as the undefeated Pinkerton Boys Freshman Lacrosse team looked to extend their winning ways on the road against a formidable Exeter Blue Hawk squad. Like their prior battles, Pinkerton struck first just mere seconds into the first frame behind a Phoenix Bealieu shot and a solid faceoff win by Zack Baker. Pinkerton would maintain control of the game in a dominant first quarter registering 5 tallies. The one blemish came from a defensive breakdown with seconds left in the final minute. The second quarter the Astros began to be challenged more, seemingly sitting back at times, and allowing the most shots on net all season. Exeter had 15 total shot attempts on the afternoon to Pinkerton's 26. Goaltender Cody Dumont was solid again, registering the most saves in any game to date with 7 on the day. At half the Astros led 8-3, and looked to clean up loose ends where they began to get sloppy toward the end of the quarter. The team responded well early putting a few more goals in the third, recording some great clears, and distributing passes well.
